Questions:

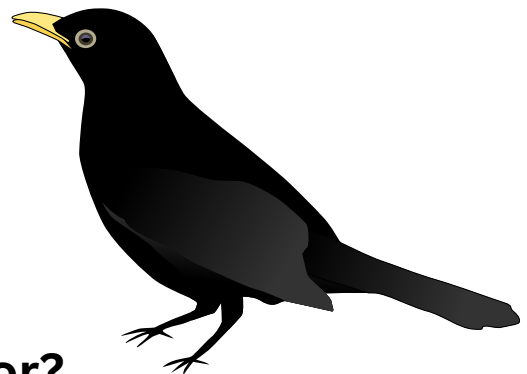
1. What did Lily find behind her house?
